The Topics

Wouldn't it be great if my resin restoration lasted 50 years!

Long term clinical trials give good insights into how long direct resin composite restorations are lasting and the factors that will influence their clinical longevity. But how different are the materials we use today from the resin composites and adhesives in use 25+ years ago? And what might that mean we could expect for durability of the current materials using best practice techniques?

This presentation will define how composites fail and the degradation process, then explore the new technologies that are improving direct resin composite clinical performance. This will lead to a recommendation on materials and technique for direct posterior composite restorations.

Improving oral health & quality of life for elderly patients

The aging population, combined with patient's desire to retain their natural dentition, brings increasing complexity and some significant hurdles for dental practices. Adapting to these challenges allows the profession to have a significant positive impact on the overall health and quality of life of aging patients.

Taking heed of the dental trends and initiatives evolving in Japan as the world's fastest aging country, The Oral Heath for an Aging Population (OHAP) initiative was established in 2015 as a collaboration between the FDI World Dental Federation and GC International. From this initiative a thinktank of clinicians and academics met in Australia to develop a structured approach to managing aging patients with a patient, clinical workflow and practice systems focus – subsequently introduced as "The Silver Wave".

Several material developments in these workflows have specific importance for the aging population including diagnostic tools, saliva biomimetics, glass ionomer cements and Glass Hybrid materials. Emerging prebiotic and probiotic technologies will also be covered as part of exploring tools for managing oral environment.

This presentation will introduce OHAP and the FDI Frailty Guide and then develop understanding of these highlighted materials as part of clinical workflows. Practical resources from FDI and GC will be highlighted that can assist clinicians with the growing challenge of an aging population.
